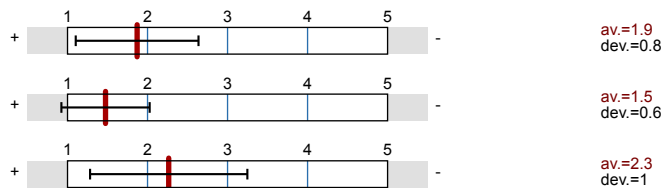

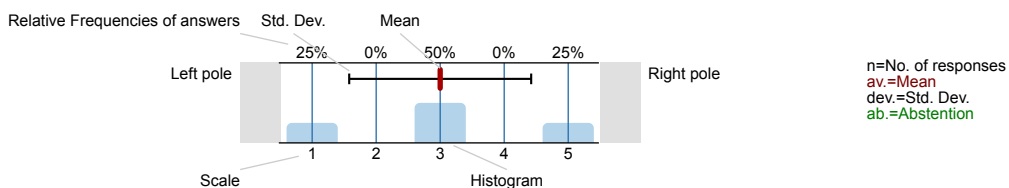

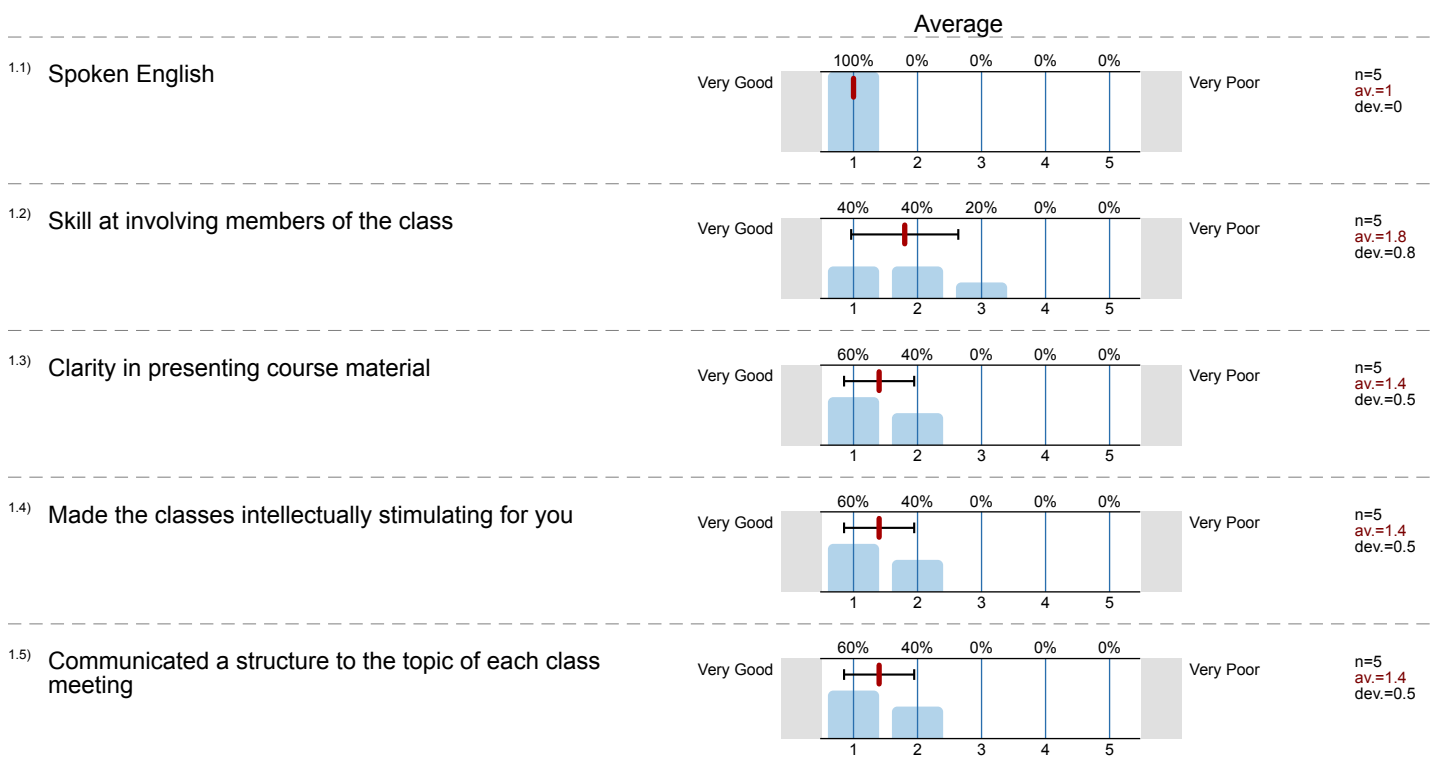


### 1. Class/Seminar Teacher Evaluation

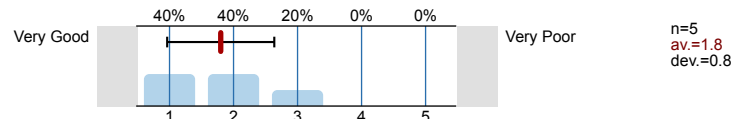

The organisation has been good. Lectures and classes are consistently at a high standard.

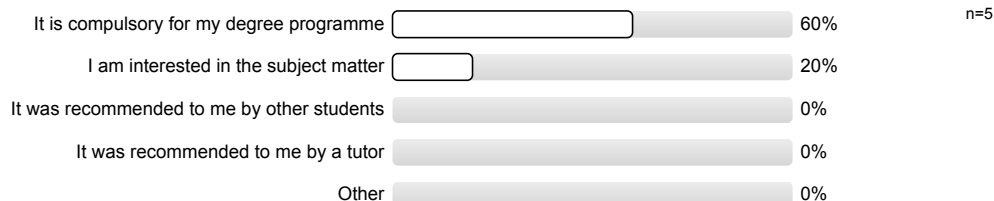
I think the structure is a bit confusing; terms are referred to in explaining other things that haven't yet been explained themselves.

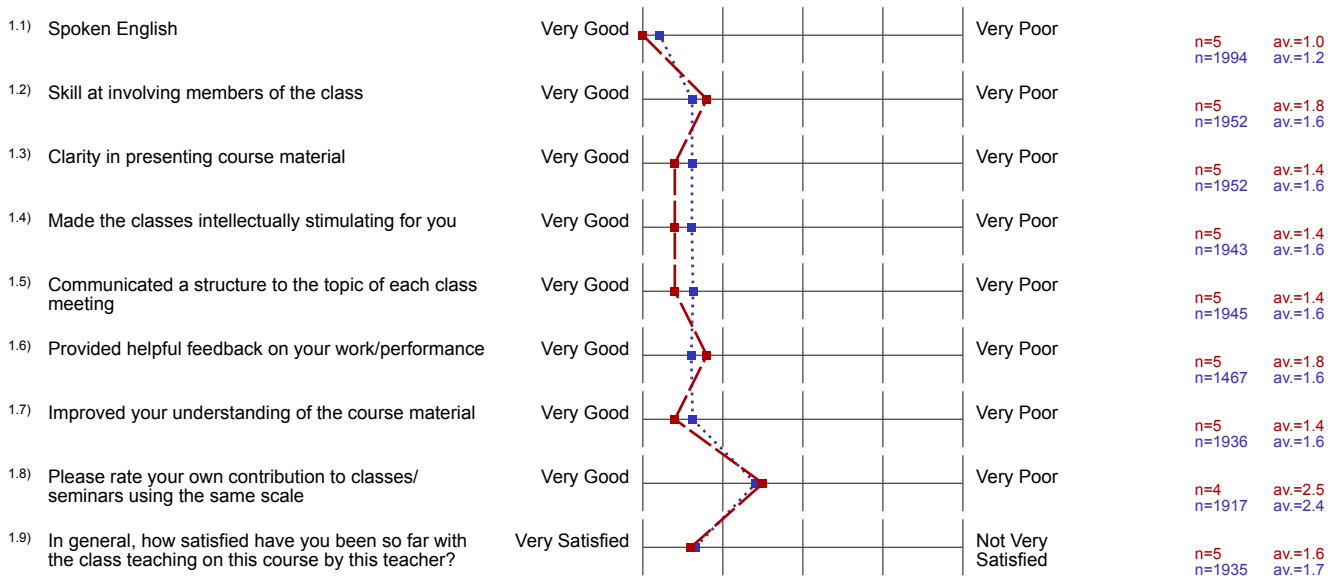
