

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
1. Looking back, the pandemic has hit Latin America particularly hard

Covid-19 mortality has been high in Latin America



Source: Our World in Data. Regional breakdown is for South America rather than LA. But Mexico has similar figures to South America.


Latin American economies were hit hard by the pandemic

Change in general government net lending/borrowing




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2. In the near term, Latin America will likely recover more slowly than advanced economies

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Latin America's vaccine rollout is lagging AEs




3. In the medium term, Latin America is likely to experience more scarring than advanced economies

Panel B: Latin America




More learning scarring expected in Latin America

School closures for longer

> Unequal impact, limited online access to education
